From The President

After a huge pre-season the 2019 season got underway without premierships players Sam Maule, Billy-Jo Russell, Lionel Brown, Liam Bury and Tom Hamilton. Long term injuries to Harry Holland and Marcus Kerin depleted our experience even further. On the plus side the return of premierships player Jaylon Wingfield, plus the continued development of our juniors, balanced our losses.

Stefan Horner, Will Waterworth, Rowan Irvine, Paul Glass, Mitchell French and Kareem Aitken came through the juniors to be valuable players for the team all year.

Playing a rebuilding West in Round 1 saw a 25 point win followed by a 2 point loss to Solomontown and then 41, 68 and 81 point wins that completed the first five rounds after playing each opponent once. Rounds 6 to 10 resulted in wins by 38, 46 (over Solomontown), 105, 6 and 18 points. Rounds 11 to 15 match ups saw wins by 5, 48, 22, and 31 points and a concerning 52 point loss to Solomontown in Round 12. The final two games saw wins by 56 points (over Solomontown) and 34 points over West to complete the minor round. This saw us narrowly win the minor premierships and set up a home second Semi Final clash against second placed Prop/Risdon Lions. A 44 point win saw us have a week off to prepare to defend our crown and make our own piece of history. Solomontown came through the Preliminary Final to make it a third Grand Final in a row between us. Trailing by 13 points at quarter time, then level at half time, leading by 16 at three quarter time and finally a 34 point victory, and we had won our 17th game out of 19 for the season and more importantly our historical first ever four-peat. Naturally we are now aiming for a five-peat in 2020. I invite everyone to join us and do what you can to achieve this goal.

Well done to James and all the players, support staff and anyone else who contributed to this historic A Grade four-peat. The club has received plenty of compliments from many sources since but that is now history. The 2020 season has begun for some of us and I ask that you all join us for the journey in any way you can. I implore all players to return to summer training in January with the goal of an A Grade five-peat and an improved B Grade result. Thanks to the players, coaches and Football Committee for all your efforts this season which brought the ultimate reward.

Many thanks also to those who worked on the Bar and Kitchen roster, particularly Peter Trewartha, our time keeper Rick Gill who does three or four games week in week out, our Trainers under Val Waterworth and our Drinks Stewards, Team Managers and all other helpers in 2019.

I must take this chance to thank those who have helped over the past twelve months. We are fortunate to have some great volunteers in our midst. It would be great to add you to our volunteer list to take some pressure off the regulars and avoid volunteer burnout. Just ask and we will find you a role. If anyone has any ideas to promote the club during the summer please let us know. We would like to be able to consider some functions to support the club during the quieter months.

Keep an ear out for the date of the upcoming AGM probably in late November. I urge you to consider nominating to join your Management Committee and to attend the AGM and hear first-hand how things are going.

Season Summary

Individual highlights include Darcy Kildea winning the Madigan Medal for the second time to equal club champion Bill Virgo in being the only South players in the SGL who have won two Madigan Medals; Kallan Warren for the Under 18s SGL Leading Goalkicker trophy, Ben Trewartha B Grade SGL Leading Goalkicker and Will Waterworth for winning the SGL Bishop Medal.

Coach James Boles has had another great year at the helm taking out his fourth premiership in his fourth year of coaching the club, with great help from the Football Committee in the retention and recruiting of players to the club.

The B's had a long year losing seven games by under 10 points and missing out on the finals for the first time in several years and we would like to thank Marcus Gill for his hard work and dedication as coach during the year in what is the hardest job at the club. We believe Marcus may retire this year and we wish him well for the future

Our Under 18s under new Coach Cameron Reid had a competitive year finishing fourth with several Under 18s playing A grade footy. Well done Cam and the boys who are the future of our club.

Highlights include:

- The A Grade winning its 17th premiership since inception in 1912 and its 12th SGL premiership, defeating Solomontown in the final; and winning four premierships in a row for the first time in the club's history. Since the SGL commenced in 1961, Ports have won thirteen premierships, West Augusta twelve and South Augusta twelve - we are closing in on them.
- Darcy Kildea winning the Madigan Medal and Kriston Thompson finishing in the Top 10 vote-getters. Ben Trewartha took out the B Grade Association goalkicking trophy.
- Caleb Ritter being awarded Best On Ground in the A Grade Grand Final.
- Will Waterworth winning the Under 18s SGL Bishop Medal, also playing several A Grade games and unlucky to miss out in the Grand Final.
- Kallan Warren, leading SGL Goalkicker 2019 in Under 18s.
- The SGL Grand Final being held once again at Central Oval and the club's success in catering for this big event. The best grand final banner once again produced by volunteers of our club.
- Player milestones including Simon Brusnahan with 200 club games, Brett Jones with 300 combined SGL and club games, Greg Shirley 100 club and A Grade games, Caleb Ritter 100 club games, Marcus Gill 150 club games, Jack Magarey 100 club games.
- South Augusta having five players in the Northern Zone team playing in the Country Championships in Port Pirie - Gary Warren, Kriston Thompson, Caleb Ritter, Will Bolitho and Darcy Kildea.
- James Boles was named as SGL Coach of the Year.
- Successful events organised by the Social Committee including the Mid-Summer Ball, Red and White Ball, Ladies Day and Family Day.
- Successful fundraising events by the Football Committee including Players Auctions, Racing Tips, Augusta Markets, increased sponsorships and Vice President's Club.
- Over 400 members for the club for the second year in a row.

- Aziel Stuart who played several games with Sturt B Grade before returning to the club for the last 11 games

FAST FACTS ABOUT THE 2019 A GRADE PREMIERSHIP

- Four premierships in a row is a club record and has only been achieved once before in the SGL by West Augusta who have won five premierships in a row from 1972-1976.
- Before this premiership only one Souths player had played four A Grade premierships in the club's 107 years, and that was Gary Kernahan. He has now been joined by Matt Downey, Vinny Urbancic, Darcy Kildea, Kahran McKenzie, Jake Collins, Aziel Stuart, Greg Shirley, Craig Shirley and Caleb Ritter. Gazz is happy about this!
- Two players, Jake Collins and Chris Heron, also played in the 2006 A Grade premiership, 14 years ago, which is an amazing effort.
- Three players, Chris Heron, Greg Shirley and Clayton Milera, also played in the 2012 A Grade premiership which was 7 years ago, so there has been a large turnover of players in that time.
- Seven players have played in all four premierships in a row - Matt Downey, Vinny Urbanic, Darcy Kildea, Kahran McKenzie, Aziel Stuart, Craig Shirley and Caleb Ritter.
- The 2019 team had seventeen players who had played juniors at the club out of the twenty-two players named which pays testament to the junior colts coaches at the club.
- The other five players who did not come through the juniors include Jake Collins (whose father Troy played over 100 senior games for the club) with four A Grade premierships; Kriston Thompson with two premierships, Northern Zone representative and State squad player; and the three lads who were recruited in 2016 - Darcy Kildea with four premierships and two Madigan Medals; Matt Downey with four premierships, two Fairest and Best and Best Team man; and Vinny Urbancic with four premierships and a reputation for being a pesty centre half forward who doesn't miss many goals. Whoever recruited them also deserves a medal!



UNDER 18s

2019 was a good year for the U18's with wins against all teams in the competition. We had a good mix of players and they gelled very well as a team. We finished fourth overall but with a very talented side I see a bright future for the club. We had four players play "A" grade with three of them playing for their first time, we also had many players help out in the "B" grade.

Congratulations to Will Waterworth for winning the Bishop medal for the SGL U18's Best and Fairest; and Kallen Warren for winning the Leading Goalkicker award with 80 goals. Well done to these two on a big year.

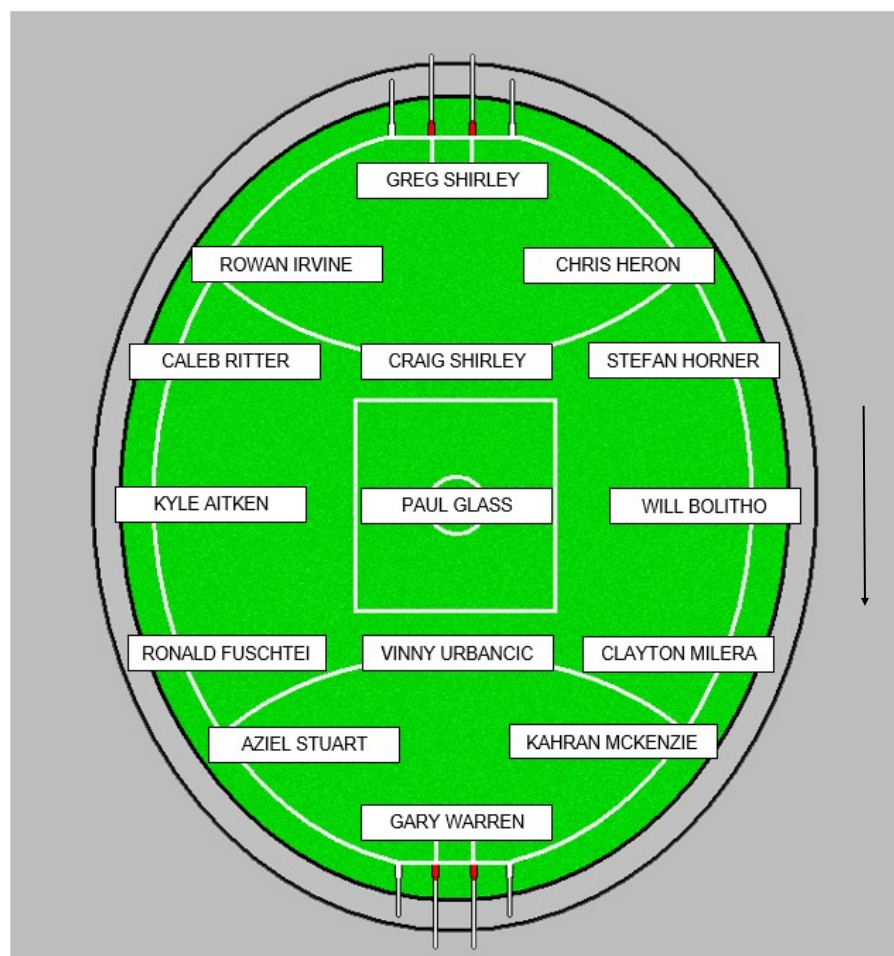
