The President From

If it wasn't for the hard work of many people, the COVID-19 SGL / PACFL seasons would not have happened. I would like to acknowledge the work done by the SGL Executive and Board, and especially our hardworking volunteers who strived to meet all COVID-19 requirements week after week. You should be very proud of our club's off and on field performances this season. If it wasn't for the work completed off field, there would not have been any on field games to watch. Fortunately, there was.

So after an interrupted pre-season, 2020 got underway without premiership players Greg Shirley and Aziel Stuart. On the plus side, the return of premiership player Billy-Jo Russell, plus the continued development of our juniors, balanced our losses. COVID-19 permits added Lawrence Bradley-Brown, Cameron Faulkner, Craig Miller and Lachlan Elliot to our playing group.

After a Round 1 bye, Round 2 saw a determined West Augusta teach us a 24 point lesson which was a wake-up call some of us needed. This initial loss was followed by 8, 16 and 33 point wins that completed the first five rounds after playing each opponent once. Rounds 7 to 10 resulted in wins by 73, 72, 29 and 38 points to complete the minor round. This saw us win the minor premiership and set up a home Second Semi Final clash against second placed PropRisdon. A desperately close 5 point loss saw us front up to Ports in a home Preliminary Final, which we won by 42 points.

Meanwhile, our B Grade side had also finished minor premiers and defeated Central Augusta in the Second Semi Final to go directly into their Grand Final. Thus both teams were off to Port Pirie to defend the A Grade crown (and make our own piece of history) and to win the B Grade crown.

On a sad note, we were without Billy-Jo Russell and Will Bolitho who both suffered late season injuries. We wish them well with their recovery. You will hear a lot more about plans to raise some funds for Will over the coming months.

After an even first half, Adam's B Grade team kicked a further six goals to Lions' two goals to grab the B Grade shield by a comfortable 29 points.

A winning margin of 42 points (after an 80 point turnaround) and we had won our historical first ever 5-peat.

Well done to James, Adam, players, support staff and anyone else who contributed to these results. The club has received plenty of compliments from many sources since, but that is now history.

The 2021 season has begun for some of us and I ask that you all join us for the journey in any way you can. I implore all players to return to summer training in January with the goal of an A Grade 6-peat and a B Grade 2-peat.

Season Summary

Both the A Grade and B Grade finished minor Premiers at the end of the shortened ten round season.

The A Grade won its 18th Premiership and its 13th SGL Premiership since the Club's inception in 1912, defeating Lions in the Grand Final. This win made it five Premierships in a row for the first time in the Club's history. Since the SGL commenced in 1961, South Augusta and Ports have won 13 Premierships, West Augusta 12, Central Augusta 7, Solomontown 4, and PropRisdon 1. We are one premiership away from being the most successful team in the SGL.

The individual highlight of 2020 was Kriston Thompson winning the Transcontinental Medal. However, the team highlights would have to be the A Grade and B Grade winning both grades for the first time since 2018 and prior to that in 1981, almost 40 years ago.

A Grade coach James Boles has had another great year at the helm, taking out his fifth premiership in his fifth year of coaching us. The B Grade had a great turnaround from missing the finals last year to winning their 12th B Grade Premiership in the 60 year history of the SGL. We would like to thank coach Adam Grantham for his hard work and dedication during the year in what is the hardest job at the club.

Our Under 18s, under coach Cameron Reid, had a competitive year going one spot better in 2020, finishing third. Under 18s team members Rex Waterworth and Patrick Kennedy made their senior debuts and several others are now ready to take the next step to senior football. Well done Cam and the boys who are the future of our club.

Other Highlights include:

- Player milestones - Daniel Dohnt (200 SGL games), Jaylon Wingfield (100 senior games - 89 A Grade + 11 B Grade)
- 50 senior games milestones - Tyrone Waye (50 B Grade), Josh Forrest (50 B Grade), and Lionel Brown (48 A Grade + 2 B Grade)
- Other Player Milestones - Jarryd Warren 50 A Grade games (+ 26 B Grade), and Jack Magarey 100 B Grade games (+ 13 A Grade games)
- Successful fundraising events by the Football Committee - two Player Auctions, Racing Tips, Augusta Markets and maintaining sponsorships and Vice Presidents Club memberships (excellent under COVID-19 conditions)
- Exceeding last year's membership total with 422 members which is possibly a club record
- Clayton Milera saved his best game until last with a 7 goal haul, being named Best on Ground in the A Grade Grand Final
- Mark Williams providing a live stream coaching session to South Augusta junior coaches during the year
- South Augusta junior (and son of Premiership player Robert), Connor Rozee playing his first AFL finals game for Port Adelaide.

FAST FACTS ABOUT THE A GRADE AND B GRADE PREMIERSHIPS

- Five Premierships in a row is a club record and has only been achieved once before in the SGL by West Augusta, from 1972-1976
- Five players have played in all 5-peat Premierships - Matt Downey, Darcy Kildea, Kahran McKenzie, Craig Shirley and Caleb Ritter
- Before the 2019 Premiership, only one player in our 107 year history had played in four A Grade Premierships - Gary Kernahan. He has now been overtaken by Matt Downey, Darcy Kildea, Kahran McKenzie, Jake Collins, Craig Shirley and Caleb Ritter. Lionel Brown, Clayton Milera, Aziel Stuart, Chris Heron, Daniel Dohnt, Vinny Urbancic and Gary Warren now equal Gary's achievement
- Jake Collins and Chris Heron also played in the 2006 A Grade Premiership 14 years ago, which is an amazing effort
- Chris Heron also played in the 2012 A Grade Premiership 8 years ago - there has been a large turnover of players in that time
- Both A Grade and B Grade have won Premierships in the same year only three times in the Club's 60 year history of SGL
- The A Grade team had 15 out of the named 22 players who had played juniors at the Club, which pays testament to our junior coaches
- The B Grade had 18 players who came through our juniors
- The seven A Grade players who did not come through the juniors were Jake Collins (five A Grade Premierships; and whose father Troy played over 100 senior games), Kriston Thompson (three Premierships and Transcontinental Medallist), Darcy Kildea (five Premierships, two Madigan Medals), Matt Downey (two Fairest and Best, five Premierships); and Lawrence Bradley-Brown, Cameron Faulkner and Craig Miller as mentioned earlier
- Congratulations to Clayton Milera who was awarded Best on Ground in the A Grade (kicking 7 goals); and Dylan Barnett who was Best on Ground in the B Grade
- South B Grade kicked 11.11 to win the Premiership in 2020; Lions A Grade kicked 11.11 to lose the Premiership in 2020. What did we kick last year in the A Grade to win the 2019 Premiership?.... That's right - 11.11
- Once again the best banner awards went to South Augusta with a big thanks to Craig Ritter, his family and helpers who did a tremendous job at late notice once they heard that banners were allowed
