NEW SMOKE-FREE/VAPE-FREE LAWS

Friday 23rd - Players

The SA Government has introduced new laws re smoking and vaping in public places. The Central Oval precinct and our club is affected. We and/or council must display sufficient, appropriate signage to show that there is no smoking or e-cigarette use allowed. If we don't we are guilty of an offence with a penalty of \$750. If we don't enforce the law we face the same penalty. Any person who smokes or uses e-cigarettes in a public area in which smoking/vaping is banned is guilty of an offence with a maximum penalty of \$750.

Council already has bans in place when the oval is in use so this new law should not be too much of a change for those of you who indulge. I ask you to observe the new laws at all times. You can find an information guide and a Q and A at clearingtheair.sa.gov.au



PORT AUGUSTA COUNCIL AUSTRALIA DAY AWARDS

You may recall the 4peat of PA Council Community Events of the Year we have won on the past four Australia Days. They were for the Kangaroo Island Western Districts FC Bushfire Recovery (raised \$5000 for the 2020 win), MS Mid-Summer Ball (\$8000 for the 2021 win), the Will Bolitho Recovery Fundraising (a substantial confidential amount for the 2022 win) and the Harley Owners Group (HOG) Rally (for the 2023 win).

This year we nominated February's Mid-Summer Ball which raised \$10547 for Dementia Australia, June's inaugural SAFC Hall of Fame, June's Jodi Lee Foundation event and October's fourth SAFC v Emergency Services match which raised \$2800 (taking our total raised for various charities over the past 5 years to over \$80000) for the 2024 award. Unfortunately, our winning run has come to an end.




Cazza's Gossip

This month newsletter is about how the Spencer Gulf League was formed. The advent of the Spencer Gulf League during the 1960's brought greater challenges to the club with the league expanding from four teams to twelve teams and including Port Pire and Whyalla teams. In 1960, the year before the S.G.L formation, South finished third losing the Preliminary Final to West 17-14 to 8-11 with best in the final Merv McKenzie, Don Harris and Robert Hearne. The A Grade captain coach was Don Harris. South's won the second's and colts finals that year. Port Augusta representatives for the year were John Main, Don Harris, Merv McKenzie, Bill Virgo, Keith McInnes with Merv McKenzie polling well in the Mail Medal and also winning the club's Fairest and Best. The new club rooms on Fern Street were opened in 1960 by Leo Nowak and Jim Brandle in front of a large crowd. Beginning in 1961, the newly formed Spencer Gulf Football League was made up from the following teams, from Port Pirie came Port, Solomontown, Proprietary and Risdon. From Whyalla came North Whyalla, West Whyalla, South Whyalla and Central Whyalla. From Port Augusta were South, West, Central and Willsden football clubs.

South's first year in the S.G.L was not a good one with the team finishing tenth, under the guidance of coach Allan Dighton who had left West to become coach of South's in a surprise move. The B Grade final was won by South 7-8 to Central 6-6. South's A Grade were hit hard this year due to the player losses of Noel Hollingsworth, Don Harris who returned to Sturt, Robert Dedman, Bill McKenzie (ex North Adelaide), Merv Pollard and Brian Masters. In a great achievement Robert Martin from South won the S.G.L Association Fairest and Best medals in both the seconds and the colts. In 1962 South finished fifth under A Grade coach Max Chynoweth. A Grade Fairest and Best was Reg Richards and Life Memberships were awarded to Robert Nowak, John Main and Merv McKenzie. President Rex Gellard had seen the club improve this year with much promise for the future years.

Next President Les Kittel knew that if the club was to be competitive in this new expanded league it would have to recruit some skilful players. In 1964 the loss of Reg Richards to Adelaide was a huge loss. However, the club did recruit well at the start of the year with the inclusion of Jimmy Anderson from Darwin, Wally Reddaway, Ray Hanrahan from West Torrens and representative player Mick Vanvacas from Whyalla, being amongst the new players at the club. Under the guidance of A Grade coach Trevor Searle South defeated Port in the Grand Final.

South's 11-17 to Ports 11-15. Best players were Bill Virgo, Jim Anderson, Mick Vanvacas, Sam Moore, David Shillabeer, Ray Hanrahan, Bud Harbridge and Trevor Searle. The crowd was reportedly 7,000 to 8,000. Club champion Bill Virgo won the Transcontinental Medal and Jack Fullerton was made a Life Member. Many regarded this final win as one of the best ever in the club's history being the only premiership by a Port Augusta team won in the then twelve team competition. The club will celebrate the 60th anniversary of this Premiership on the 29th June this year at the Past Players and Officials Day.


Robert Fiebig is again captain and the team improves on last year to play off in the Grand Final. However, they lose to Redsox off the last ball of the day in a controversial result where many thought the Redsox batsman had not made his ground and was runout. South defeated Quorn in the 2nd Semi Final to play off in the Grand Final. South 142 vs Redsox 8/143. New players to the A Grade this year include Phil Williams, Kym Maule, Peter Trewartha, fast bowler Shane Marsland, Robert Laube and Michael Dignan who took 7/29 during the season with his spinners. In the final South batted first and made 142 with the best bats Phil Williams 54 and Kym Maule 21. Others included David Allanson 8, Don Pasculli 0, Rob Fiebig 17, Peter Trewartha 2, Robert Rozee 16, Shane Marsland 0, Robert Laube 4, Don Fiebig 9 not out and Dean Barry 7. Best bowlers for Redsox were Barry Rimmer 5/34 and Zoran Kurbatfinski 3/35. Redsox made the runs in the last over with the best Peter Groves with 27 and Shane Strawbridge with 29. South best bowlers were Robert Rozee with 4/29, Shane Marsland 2/41, Don Fiebig 1/36, Dean Barry 0/24 and Robert Laube 0/8. The association medal went to Rob Fiebig and he also came runner up in the batting aggregate with 743 runs and in the batting average with 61.9 runs.

WHERE ARE THEY NOW

Great to see Derek Edmead at the South Augusta get together at the cricket Test recently.

Derek played 97 A Grade games and 50 B Grade games from 1978 to 1987 after coming through South juniors. Derek played in the 1981 and 1983 A Grade Premierships together with

the 1985 B Grade Premiership. Five Edmead brothers played at South which would be close to a record (shared with the five Kerin brothers). Derek was known as a fast leading forward with goal kicking ability. He played no small part in the premiership wins. Derek is now retired after working in civil engineering during his working life. After he left South he moved to Adelaide and worked on several railway projects including Port Headland
