

#### **A Grade Report**

This season was one of growth but also lost opportunity. The Club was keen to see Finals action again after a disappointing year prior and achieved this goal and many other positives looking forward, but the fact that we also underachieved and let a real chance at the Flag slip should drive us.

Following a well represented month of Off Season training prior to Christmas, the Pre Season programme began on January 18th. Training twice a week we focussed on skill development and decision making from the outset, as these were recognised as deficiencies, as well as general game-like conditioning on the track. Numbers were impressive and most players trained with a genuine intention of self improvement. We had a successful training camp at Pichi Richi Park with thanks to Nic and Jodie Boully for again making this facility available. The first two trial games against North Whyalla and BMW gave us a good look at individual players as well as identifying areas of both strength and weakness. Our last trial against Kimba was a "dress-rehearsal" for Round 1 vs Ports and the team gelled very well and followed this up with good wins in the first two rounds.

We then played poorly for a number of weeks and it became clear consistency was an issue for us. Other than a very good patch of 5 straight wins in the back half of the season we seemed to struggle to follow up a good week or fortnight with another. Fortunately for us our opponents seemed to have similar issues and we found ourselves on top of the table at the end of the minor round with 11 wins and 6 losses. Our major round was extremely disappointing, losing both games in 30 minute lapses, showing a lack of hunger and responsibility in this time- the basics of success; as proven on Grand Final day by winning underdogs Solomontown. I believe those players who are hurting and keen to make amends will push their names in the way they approach the 2015 program in terms of selfless commitment and sacrifice to make it happen. Some have said our best football was superior to any other teams on our day in 2014 but that implies that it's a mental thing and that we need the "planets to align" to be the best when really we just need to be BETTER THAN ANYONE ON ANY DAY and will get there if we can ignore the temptation to make excuses or wait for the easier path and instead challenge ourselves to strive for perfection.

#### **Under 9s report**

Twenty seven young men have done themselves, their family and the club proud by displaying a great commitment to their sport throughout the past 6 months. The improvement from every single player in the 2 years that I have coached the Under 9's has been fantastic.

Last season the team struggled with consistency from week to week, and too often relied on a few to do the job. Some improvement has certainly come by the boys being 1 year older, but there were other aspects of their individual game or the team game, which was taught at training, and more importantly was grasped by most players when in the heat of the battle.

In 13 weeks of Football, we had 12 different 'Bulldog of the Day' medals handed out. These medals weren't just handed out to young men who did better than expected, they were earned. To have 12 different Footballers stand up on that one day and be the best footballer wearing the White V, further shows our club will continue to have a bright future.

Emphasis I placed on the kids throughout the whole season was:

- We are here for Football, and Football only. We come switched on for 2 hours a week, concentrating on our Football.
- If you want a kick, you have to go and get the ball yourself, and when you get to the ball, put your head over it and good things will come.
- Run, run, run and when you can't run anymore, you run.

Get over to help your teammate, don't wait for the easy kick.

We were also able to work on some special little things towards the end of the season, which was amazingly bought into our game.

- Our boys were instructed to get their arms up when about to be tackled, to allow for a handball to be given. Some excellent handballs at the Quorn Carnival was a direct result of this instruction.
- At contests, its best to have someone behind just in case. Another is forward of the contest, and allows the player who is covering to time his run and receive the ball. At times during the Quorn Carnival we displayed something similar to what we had been working on. Resulting in 2 great team goals.

From the start of the season to about half way through the year, we were on par with West and Central Red and were clearly a step behind the Central Black team, who had one very strong player. Over the course of the year, we gradually became a stronger unit than West and Central Red and had made ground on Central Black. Our final game vs West was disappointing as were beaten easily.

Heading to the Quorn Carnival I was confident we would play well on the smaller oval, and the boys looked forward to the challenge. Our first game we started extremely well vs Quorn/BMW and the boys recorded a great win as the wind started to pick up.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> game vs West was going to be a test, as we kicked against the breeze in the first half. The boys committed themselves well during the half, restricting Wests opportunities, as the ball was mostly in our forward half. The second half started well, kicking goals and sealing a good win.

Our 3<sup>rd</sup> game was our best vs Roxby Downs. Knowing that we were likely to vs Centrals as both undefeated teams, I was able to rest 9 older boys in one half and 9 others in the second half, while our younger boys played a full game. The attack on the football and the body, and the way the ball moved quickly forward was an absolute joy to watch, as many parents were amazed by the way the boys played.

Final game for 2014 was 'The Final' as both us and Centrals had yet to lose. All season long I built this up as our ultimate challenge as this was a combined Centrals team, and the message was simple.....'let's have a crack at them'. We kicked with the wind, and this certainly helped us put Centrals under pressure, and we looked the better side. In the second half, the challenge for the boys was to play smart football and continue to kick it long to each other, and numbers had to get to where we were kicking to. In the end, it was the quality of a few Central footballers that got them over the line, but our boys certainly took a giant step to only lose by 2 Goals 4.

### South Augusta players and members that have died in 2014

**Ray Miller**: Ray played for the club from 1942 to 1957 having moved from Western Australia and he played over 100 games for the club. Ray coached the club in 1943 and 1944 and was A Grade Captain in 1943 having unfortunately been injured for the 1942 Premiership. Ray formed a partnership with John McElligott and coached the clubs Under 18s and Colts from 1960 for several years with great success before moving to West Augusta where he continued to coach.

**Maurice Gigney**: The last surviving member of the 1942 A Grade Premiership side. Maurice, aged 91, lived in Adelaide and played for the club from 1942 to 1946 and was named 3rd best player in the final when they beat Central. Maurice also worked in the Railways and was a well-respected member of the community.

**Keith McInnis**: Keith was a player Life member and played Senior football for Souths between 1949-1964, including the 1964 A Grade Premiership. Keith was aged 30 when he played in the final and he played in a Seconds Premiership in his first year 1949 and a League premiership in his last year – 1964. He served on the Management Committee from 1961-1963 and as secretary for 1 year.

#### TWO POINT WIN AFTER MAGNIFICENT REVIVAL

Staging a magnificent revival in the third quarter of the SGL grand final at Port Augusta on Sunday, South Augusta outplayed Port to take the 1964 title by two points.

Played in ideal conditions at Central Oval, the match was a thrilling climax to the SGL season. Opening with tons of dash the home team had a major on the board within two minutes when Vanvacas streaked from a pack to find an open goal. A long shot by Searle called up one flag and a similar result came when Baker let fly from a scrimmage. Pulling down a kick off Shillabeer drove in for the pacy Vanvacas to post South Augusta's second six pointer.

Outpacing the green and whites and making position well, the Port Augusta team streamed forward again only to see a golden opportunity lost when Hanrahan missed a sitter from close in. Both teams were displaying plenty of speed and going in hard but Umpire O'Connell kept a tight grip on the game. Recovering from the initial onslaught of the pacy red and whites, Port swung into action and an angle shot by McGuiness, which went wide, was followed by O'Dea flying high to open their goal account. Keeping up the pressure, Port shot through two more singles before Keain swerved from a pack to snap accurately. A free to O'Dea in the goal square saw Port, who were using cool, pacy teamwork, achieve their third major. Hanrahan then had another great chance to bring South Augusta back into the game when he marked dead in front, only to see his shot go astray for a single. A brilliant solo effort by Mezzino was followed by two more singles for the Pirie team. Marking a kick off, Keain drove in for Tattoli to whip the ball to Simon Pisani for Port's fourth six pointer. With skipper Deane in the van, the green and whites surged forward at the resumption of the second quarter, and a shot by Tattoli hit the post. Tattoli then handballed to Mezzino, whose shot was pulled down by O'Dea for another single. Snapping up a pass from Vic Pisani, brother Simon, who seemed to be everywhere, made no mistake when he let fly at the big opening. Playing strong, confident football, the green and whites bored forward relentlessly and scored behinds before the mercurial Simon Pisani snapped his third goal. Despite the tireless resistance of Virgo, who was marking everything that came his way and the cooly efficient Anderson. Port continued to break through. A brace of goals from Kean jumped Port into a commanding position. South Augusta then achieved their first success for the term when a single by Shillabeer was followed by a major from the high flying Hanrahan. Thirty two points in front, Port seemingly had the game sewn up at half time and the future looked black for the home team.

Port were the first away and a point was rushed before the Red and whites broke the pressure. South Augusta then swung right back into the game and more than matching their tough opponents in all departments, threw the green and whites back in desperate defence of their goal. With Vanvacas in everything South Augusta started to call the tune. Three singles went on the board before Searle flew high to open the home team's spate of goals for this quarter. Fullarton then drove in for Burk to score through an open goal. Port recovered to add two singles to their total but the rejuvenated red and whites were quickly back in attack again and a brace of singles preceded a six pointer from Uma. Slamming forward again South Augusta shortened the odds when a free to Reddaway was followed by a major from Searle. Driving forward from the bounce, the home team cut their deficit to two points when Chynoweth goaled from a scrimmage. With half a minute to go, Moore, to the wild delight of the home team's big following, lifted them to a four point lead.

Three minutes from the opening bounce, in the final term Moore angled through for a point and then Vanvacas goaled on the run to lengthen the Red and whites lead to 11 points. Fighting back desperately, Port reduced their leeway to five points when Murphy found the big opening. Tattoli then had a long shot which went out, but Simon Pisani made no mistake and Port were again in the lead – by one point. Amid tense excitement, South Augusta evened the scores, and then a single followed by a goal from Hanrahan saw the fiercely battling red and whites seven points clear. Three quick valuable points saw the home team edging further ahead but Port were still in the game. With eight minutes to go, Port shortened their deficit to four points when Tattoli goaled from a free. Battling their way through South Augusta's tight defences, Port whipped on two more singles, but time was running out, and the jubilant red and whites got home by two points.
