A Grade Report



The 2015 season was eagerly anticipated due largely to the relocation of the Club to the Central Oval venue but also due to a disappointing 2014 finals campaign after finishing minor premiers in that year. The off-season/ pre-season period saw a number of new A grade players join the club, namely Daniel Roach, Tom Carling and Simon George, who went some way in replacing a number of departures from the 2014 season. Pre-season involved pre-Christmas sessions before beginning

in earnest mid-January. Numbers were pleasing again this year and those who attended the training camp worked very well in their teams in 40 degree heat at Melrose. As we neared trial games team spirit was exceptional and (most) bodies were in good shape. James “Jackhammer” Boles helped Dexter and myself with pre-season this year which added some extra insight and Jake Collins took some core strength sessions in the early part designed to reduce soft tissue injuries. Thank you to these men. We played two trial games with the first being against Christian Brothers Old Collegians and the other, with A grade and B grade represented, against regular opponent Kimba, at Kimba. We managed to win these games reasonably comfortably but more importantly had a good look at all players for Round 1 selection. The season itself could be broken into 3 parts. We began the year well, winning 3 games and losing two narrowly through the first round of games. Unfortunately Daniel Roach was injured for most of that period and no-one could have foreseen the five weeks that followed. We lost numerous players to injury and unavailability, in fact 10 or a dozen missed a game against West which we lost by a huge margin – one of 5 games straight where we failed to get the points. Brock Laube left for work in Port Lincoln which meant were without his services for numerous rounds through the rest of the season. To cap it off we lost our Head Trainer Peter Walsh who had done a terrific job with the South Augusta Football Club for many years. Fortunately Val Waterworth, Hannah Carling, Wayne Cox and the Trainers filled Walshy’s void for the rest of the year and we appreciate that immensely.

Thankfully, David Robinson and Matt Grantham returned to A grade football and the likes of Liam Bury and Adam Bentley stepped up when the opportunity arose - all were key players in a form turn-around in the back half of the season. Others returned from injury also and as these regained fitness our form was building and the wins were coming. I believe we only played two poor games during this period but unfortunately one of these was against West Augusta in the 1st Semi Final where we lost by 22 points. While watching Lions and Centrals battle it out in the Grand Final it was yet another case of what may have been for South Augusta having had strong recent form against both sides. Regardless of the disappointment of our final placing I am proud of the effort put in by our players in an extraordinarily challenging year where for the main part things weren’t falling in place on and off the field. Despite this players grasped the importance of playing their role for the team and together the team showed great resilience and character to dig their way out of what looked like being a horror season to just fall short in a very even competition.

Sincere thanks to Assistant Shane Kennedy, self-appointed Mentor James Boles, Runner Lee Wilcock, Team Manager Nick Heron and Statistician and Senior Football Director Michael Kerin – all very reliable people who excel in their roles. **Cameron Redden**

Under 15s Report

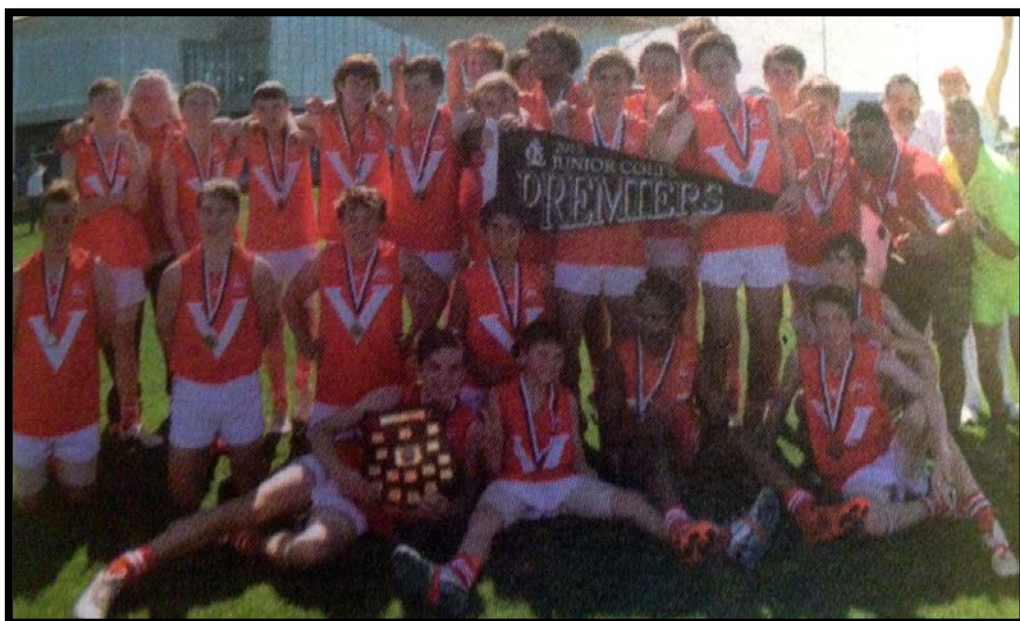

We split the sides quite fairly, as both teams played off against each other in the Preliminary Final, finishing the season 2nd and 3rd. The results for the 4 games played, were a 2-2 split.

We as a team earned our way to the Grand Final, by understanding the importance of situations in crucial times, which helped us finish 2nd at the end of the minor round.

We started the season with a loss to South White and a close loss to the eventual Premier, before dominating the other 3 teams and establishing ourselves as a contender. Roll around to South White and suddenly we were looking good. A 13 vs 13 game against West didn't help, as the wheels fell off and we lost 4 out of 5 games and had slid all the way to fourth. 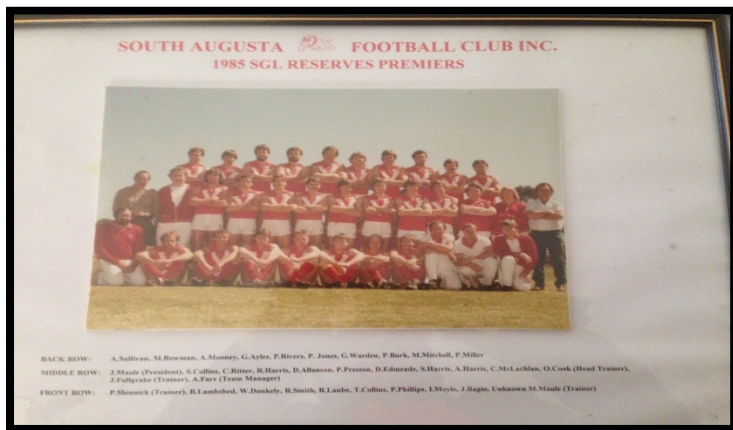
