UNDER 11'S

The 2005 season was a very successful year for the club's U 11's grade. Whilst not finishing in top position, the boys won 13 games and lost only two games, both to Quorn Wolves Red. Whilst there are no finals played in U11 's, the final game of the year against Quorn Wolves Red was a grand final with the winner being able to lay claim as the U 11's premiers. Unfortunately, despite a great effort and commitment by the boys, we were beaten by a better side on the day going down narrowly by less than two goals.

Overall during the year, we kicked 87 - 113 (633 points) and only had 17 - 19 (121) kicked against us, this equates to a percentage of 81 % and clearly shows that U11's were dominant in most games and only lost narrowly on the two occasions that we were defeated.

Throughout the year, the attendance and attitude of players at training was excellent with an average of 24 players from a playing list of 31 training each week, and with an interchange ranging from a minimum of three players up to seven players each game. Both Grant and myself endeavoured to ensure players were encouraged through an even distribution of weekly awards and equitable game time. Of the 25 players who played consistently each week, 22 of them played in excess of 71 % game time, meaning 88% of U11 players averaged nearly % quarters of a game each week.

Five Captains were selected following the first four weeks training. They were; Michael Morse, Louis Fox, Macauley Finlay, Kenneth Abrahamson-Davey and Nathan Coutts. They were rotated weekly with two Captains nominated each game, each of them led by example and were consistently in our best players each week, all of them figured prominently in best and fairest voting at the end of the year.
