





Thank you to the footy committee who worked hard to change a bit of the atmosphere on game day with some new ideas and in particular the Footy Frenzy Day which was well supported by all age groups, culminating in Mitch Robinson's performance for the A Grade. It was a great atmosphere and experience that was the envy of a lot of other clubs in the SGL.

On field we had a disappointing season overall with only the U15s representing the club in the finals. In fact we were the only club to not be represented on Grand Final day, that's not a good place to be in, and we should be striving to feature on Grand Final Day every year.

From the start of the season when 51 people showed up to the first preseason training to then finish the year with Stuey having to find 8 players the morning of the last minor round game, probably says a lot about where the club is currently at in terms of its playing stocks. I have said to the players that I'll be honest with them, and I honestly think our club is in a world of trouble. It would not surprise me if we struggle to field a B Grade side next year. I hope that I am wrong but given the lack of commitment by a lot of players, some of the team being shift workers, therefore unavailable every week and the use of veterans who have likely played their last season of football, I really do worry about the senior numbers moving forward.

I want to congratulate all those who win awards tonight and also to the players who made their senior debuts and reached milestones throughout the course of the season. Congratulations on these individual accolades.

I really hope this season is a humbling and learning experience for a lot of players. Humbling in terms of results and finishing at the bottom of the ladder. A learning experience because as a group there needs to be significant improvement in attitude, dedication and commitment to being a good team mate, a good player and ultimately a good team. We aren't that at the moment. But things can change quickly if everyone is willing to put in the work and not accept the season that we've just had.

We need to be a better club at embracing and welcoming new people, new families to our club. There is a common theme locally that this isn't a very welcoming place which is disappointing to hear. We need to do better.

Everyone just expects the South Augusta Football Club to be there year after year. Because for 100+ years we always have been. Everyone thinks that Friday night teas will just happen because a cooking team is rostered on like it has always been.

Our existence in this competition is going to depend on how hard we are willing to work from this moment on. We have dwindling numbers in the junior grades compared to a lot of other local clubs, and our volunteers are the same people week after week, year after year.

We may be here now, but tomorrow is not guaranteed. Please do your bit to get involved no matter how big or how small the task maybe.



After a pre-season movement of players into and out of the club the 2025 season got underway without players Cohen Boscence, Kyle Aitken, Daniel Sumner, Aziel Stuart, Tyson Darley, Heath Green, Clayton Milera, Pat Fischer, Chris Heron, William Newberry and Matthew Webb.

The A Grade, B Grade and under 18s all finished 6th for the season, for what has been a challenging year for the senior coaches and staff.

We must thank A Grade Coach Adam Grantham, B Grade coach Stuart Beaton and U18 coach Marcus Gill on their hard work and dedication in getting their teams on the ground each week.

In the 2025 season Trent Ritter kicked the most goals in the A Grade with 24 goals. Caleb Ritter was mentioned in the best players an impressive 15 times during the year, Craig Shirley 8 times, Darcy Kildea 7 times and Trent Ritter 5 times.

We used a total of 90 players in both A Grade and B Grade in 2025 which is even higher than the 81 in 2024. Of the 28 players who played A Grade during the year only 4 have played over 100 A Grade games, and another 6 have played over 50 A Grade games which leaves 18 who have played less than 50 A Grade games.


