Hi all

SANFL KICKSTART FOR WOMEN INTO COACHING







ROWAN IRVINE—100 CLUB GAMES

Recently South Augusta heard the sad news that former Coach Malcolm Dixon had passed away. Its 50 year since he coached the club for 3 years from 1975 to 1977. Malcolm took the club from 5th in 1974 to playing off in the Grand Final in 1975 before losing to West Augusta. Before Malcolm took over the club had not played in a Grand Final since 1967, 8 years beforehand. South finished 5th at the end of the minor round and had an excellent run of form to make the Grand Final. South finished 5th in 1976 and 3rd in 1977 when they lost to Props by a small margin in the Preliminary Final. Although not achieving ultimate success Malcolm had the full respect of the players at the time and was known as an intelligent, hard, professional coach who got the best out of his players. Malcolm was also a champion player with West Augusta and North Adelaide where he won a Fairest and Best and he also coached at Willsden. His son-in-law Cameron Redden also coached South in 2014 and 2015. The club offers its condolences to the Dixon and Redden families at this sad time.

This Months newsletter focuses on the Shillabeer Family

David Shillabeer

David played for South from 1963-1978, David played Senior Colts for South Augusta and progressed to play with SANFL at league level with Norwood . David at the age of 17 was a member of the 1964 premiership team coached by Trevor Searle. Player Life Member David commenced his senior football career with South's in 1963 he also played football in Port Pirie and Whyalla before returning to South's in 1973 where he played 149 league and 176 Seconds games until his retirement in 1978. He was selected in the S.G.L. team of the year in 1971, 1973, and 1974. He was the league leading goal kicker in 1973 and 1974 David coached the Seconds from 1978 to 1983 and again in 1987 and 1988 with Premierships in 1978, 1979, 1980, and 1981. He is a member of the South Augusta and Port Augusta Hall of Fame.

Mark Shillabeer

Mark served as a trainer for the club uninterrupted from 1994 a total of 18 years to just recently when he moved to Moonta. He played no small part in the premiership successes in 1994, 2000 and 2006, and is well respected by the players. Mark has been a life member of the South Augusta Football Club since 2007.

Phillip Shillabeer

Phil, a Life member played senior football for the club in 1973 and has served in a number of areas of the football operations departments. He was team manager of the seconds from 1991 to 1993, and league team manager from 1994-2005, a total of 15 years. Phillip acted as the club statistician for many years.

In 1998 Phillip was selected as club person of the year for his outstanding contribution to the South Augusta Football Club.

Brian Shillabeer

A Player Life Member, Brian played 149 Leage and 177 Second games (326 Senior games in total) from 1977-1997, including a league premiership in 1993, and seconds premierships in 1978, 1979, 1981, 1990, 1991, and 1995 (Captain). He coached the seconds in 1986 and served on the football committee from 2002 until 2005. He is a member of the South Augusta and Port Augusta Hall of Fame.

Robert Shillabeer


Robert played Juniors and seniors football for South for a number of years before transferring to the Central Augusta Football Club. Robert is now living in the Gawler Area.

Darren Shillabeer

Darren played juniors and senior Football for South, being part of the 2006 A Grade Premiership. He has played and coached at many clubs throughout the state including North Adelaide. Darren present has taken a roll as a coach and previously Darren also played for the Central Augusta Football Club.

Nicole Shillabeer

Nicole is currently on the South Augusta Management Committee and serves as Head Trainer, having been involved for over 7 years as a trainer. Nicole has been in involved with several A and B Grade Premierships as a trainer and serves at the Souths bar together with other voluntary roles in sponsorship and other areas.



Jeff Shillabeer

Jeff commenced playing football with the South Augusta Club in 1969 and he continued for eight seasons before injuries curtailed his career at the end of 1976. Although still relatively young Jeff did not quit the sport he loved, he still wanted to be involved.

Even in his last year of playing he was also the club's under 15's coach. In 1977 and 1978 he continued to coach the under 15 side and at the same time was a goal umpire with the Port Augusta Football league.

He has the distinction of being a goal umpire in the 1978 league grand final. In 1979 he was the team manager for the club's seconds and still goal umpired for several games. For the next two years he was both a trainer and the club's property steward. Then from 1986 until 1988 he was again the seconds team manager and followed this up as the club's timekeeper for two years.

Though the 1990's Jeff was involved with the South Augusta and Port Augusta Football league. During this time, he was a club secretary and league delegate. In 1995 he was the league's secretary and in 1998 he was the thirds team manager.

At the start of the new millennium, Jeff put his football energy into the Port Augusta Football League and for the ten years he was the league secretary.

Jeff Shillabeer has devoted over forty years to football in Port Augusta and has enjoyed the rewards of winning premierships at all levels, throughout his playing and administration he has been held in the highest regard at all levels and throughout the state. Jeff is a Life Member of the South Augusta Football Club. Jeff was inducted into the South Augusta and Port Augusta League Hall of fame.

JODI LEE FOUNDATION EVENT....TALKING SHI!T

We are extremely proud to once again be chosen by the Jodi Lee Foundation to host their Port Augusta event probably in September. We did such a great job in 2023 when we were "repeatedly mentioned as the best place to connect with the Port Augusta community!' In partnership with the Australian Government Department of Health and Aged Care, the Foundation is raising awareness and educating the community on the importance of doing the free Bowel Cancer Screening Kit when it arrives in the mail for 45–74-year-olds. It aims to promote positive health and well-being messages including regular bowel cancer screening tests. For more information check out https://jodileefoundation.org.au/

JODI'S STORY

Jodi was complaining of constipation, abdominal pain and some bloating. Her doctor quickly recognised an obstruction in her bowel and ordered scans. Jodi had cancer and the tumour had all but blocked her bowel. She was only 39 but the cancer had spread to her lymph and liver. She passed away aged 41. She had no family history and no symptoms whatsoever, which is typical of bowel cancer. It could have had a different ending if her bowel cancer had been detected early. The Jodi Lee Foundation is a leading voice for bowel cancer prevention through initiatives to raise awareness about it which is the second leading cause of cancer-related death in Australia. But it doesn't have to be. If detected in the early stages, it can be up to 90% treatable. Bowel cancer often develops without any symptoms, which is why screening is so important. Unfortunately, too many 45–75-year-old Australians are ignoring this free, life-saving test when it arrives in the mail from the Australian Government every two years. The campaign aims to encourage Australians to complete the test as soon as they can and send it back.
