

Both boys have performed consistently well in the B Grade, earning their chance for a go in the A Grade.







This month's news is about the Rivers family and their involvement with the club.

Jared Rivers

One of the South's juniors of the 2000 decade was Jared Rivers who played for Melbourne Football Club in the A.F.L. Jared played junior football for the South Augusta and was part of the 2000 A Grade premiership team at the age of fifteen, taking on much stronger opponents. The North Adelaide Football Club spotted his raw talent and soon he was playing Seniors under Darrel Hart, who described him as a delight to coach, he was rising quickly as a potential top ten draft pick and was selected to play for South Australia under 18 team in the national competition, unfortunately he injured his wrist in the lead up match. But Scouts from Melbourne Demons like what the saw and selected him as the 27th pick overall in the draft of 2000, after a solid preseason Jarred cemented his spot in the team and was quickly noticed by many in the football community this resulted in his round three nomination for National bank rising star in 2004. Jarred was runner up for Melbourne's club Fairest and Best in 2011 after an excellent season. He was later to go on and play for Geelong and played 150 games for Melbourne and 44 games for Geelong, total 194 games. Jared is currently Assistant Coach at St Kilda, and he played for South Augusta from 1999 to 2001.

Jess Rivers

Jess played for South's from 1997-2001 he was a member in the 2000 and 2012 A Grade premiership sides. South's won in the grand final against Willsden in 2000, Scores 14-6 to 12-10 best players were Jess Rivers and Jared Rivers. Jess played 101 A Grade games and 1 B Grade game for a total of 102 games.

Peter Rivers

Peter Rivers, father of Jared and Jess coached South to Premierships in 2012 and 2000. In 1979 Peter was named South Augusta Fairest and Best Player and he was awarded Life membership in recent years. Peter played 58 A Grade and 60 B Grade games together with 42 A Grade for Willsden. He played for South's from 1975-1990 and took on various other roles including junior coaches and Committee. Peter passed away this year and will always be remembered as a great mentor and coach for the junior players and a Premiership Coach.

Peter was recruited by Souths in 1975 and continued as a player until 1990. He was a tireless ruckman who always gave his best, and he inspired and encouraged others to follow his example. He won the league Best and Fairest award in 1979 and was runner-up on a number of occasions. He coached the seconds from 1989 until 1992
