It's up to us - if we see something, say something. The SGFL has received correspondence around these issues. Please be reminded about how we act at footy games and enjoy the game and appreciate all the people involved are doing the best they can.

Recently I was invited to a meeting with the Council CEO and Mayor along with the PA Club presidents and SGFL President, the meeting was hopefully a catalyst for future meetings. It was primarily to discuss how footy in Pt Augusta is run, what the structure looks like, how are we funded on match days etc, it was an opportunity to discuss some concerns we have and how the group can continue to have constructed discussion. Council have pressures to not increase rates to a sustainable level and have an obligation to get the best outcome for not only rate payers but the community as a whole, while some areas of council may not create a surplus, it's not about the money, it's more about what council can provide. It's about what clubs and organisations offer the community through their programmes and how they are the glue that binds the community, it's about what they provide that council can't or doesn't and the cost savings to Council this creates. There are people within the community that think Central Oval needs to be sold off, or the running of it is allocated to an external organisation, it's a white elephant we don't need it. Articles recently in the Advertiser don't help the cause, we are at Central Oval, it is our home we intend to keep it that way.

There are a few things in the pipeline that I will inform you on as we continue through the year.

Now it's back to the drawing board. We'll keep working hard, aim to string together a few more wins, and give ourselves every chance of staying in contention for a top-four finish.

Under 18 Report

Unfortunately, since our last Report the U18s landscape hasn't changed a lot in terms of the Win/Loss Ratio. Its no doubt the boys are battling hard and should be aiming to notch a win in the remaining 6-7 games. These boys need to change their training habits and commitment to the game if they are to see any improvements with the last round of games to come.

The message over the last couple of weeks has been clear to the group, that these young men will not improve by only attending a training for 30mins once a week. Parents you play a role in this also, please encourage them to attend both training nights. 30 minutes a week is not enough, and the results show. Training nights should be about trying to get better. Not just a ticking the box exercise. It's a great time to have a run around, catch up with friends but also be willing to listen, learn and try to improve. Compare 1 week of training Tuesday and Thursday nights and how that equates to approximately 3hrs worth of development vs 1x 30min session. The improvement from that alone would be stark.

The big change that has occurred in the U18s however is that Marcus Gill has stepped down from the coaching role after 2 ½ years at the helm. The club is severely indebted to Marcus for stepping up and taking on this challenging position, especially with no connection to the group other than a love for football, and the South Augusta Football Club. Marcus stepped up in club's time of need, hoping to teach, shape and develop these boys into good senior players but most importantly good people. Hopefully with a fresh voice these boys can continue to develop and improve. Marcus' reward wont necessarily be the games won or lost whilst coaching the last 2 ½ years. It will be seeing these young men go on to be good Reserves or League players for South Augusta. Marcus decision wasn't made lightly as he felt strongly about these men he has spent a couple of years with. The decision was helped knowing that there were capable assistants willing to step up and complete the season.

A big thankyou to Ethan Gade and Jesse Hockney-Forrester (both players currently are in leadership roles as vice captain and captain for the League and Reserve teams). Jesse and Ethan are both passionate football people who want this group to strive to be the best they can be. Both are encouraging and willing to continue to teach this group about the game.

All the best to Marcus, we are sure you'll see him continue volunteering for the Football Club as that's what good club people do. Good luck to Jesse and Ethan for the remainder of the year. The entire football club are behind you boys as you strive to finish the season on a high.

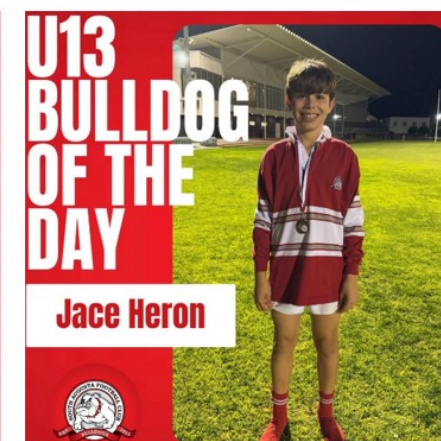
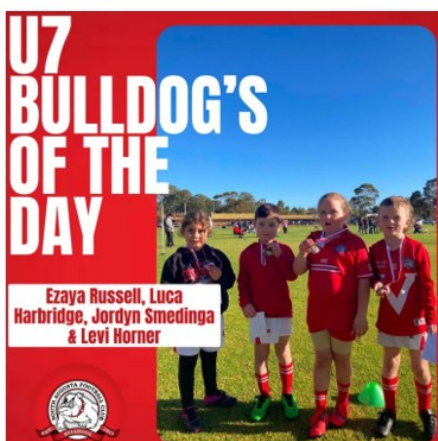
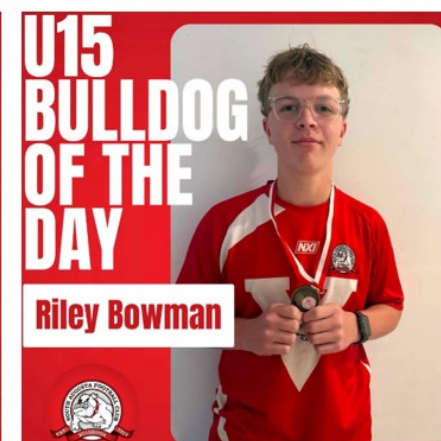

SANFL NEWS...COMMUNITY FOOTBALL FAIR PLAY RULE FOR JUNIOR GRADES

Something new to watch out for this season is the implementation of the mandatory statewide Fair Play policy for all junior male and female grades up to U18's. The aim is to "instil in all involved in junior football that a one-sided match has a detrimental impact on player development (for both teams) and most importantly player retention". It aims to give players a positive match-day experience by reducing the number of one-sided matches. Various possession rules will be implemented once a team leads by 60 points.

Gazza's Gossip

This month is about the 1980s, the John Reid revolution which brought great excitement ahead of the 1980 season. John, who had coached at Woodville and South Adelaide seconds in 1979 had moved to Port Augusta in Consumer Affairs. Some swift work by then President Bruce Curtis and David Shillabeer saw him replace Pat Hynes as senior coach in a mutual agreement. John would also go on to be involved with the Crows in their back-to-back Premierships with his great mate Malcolm Blight. Blighty held JR in the highest regards.

John was to stay with the club for 3 years making the finals each year and winning an A Grade Premiership in 1981 and Runner Up in 1982. John's methods and mentality changed the SGL with tactics, pre-season training regimes and preparation for games. This included changing at the club and then jogging to the oval pre-game, motivational speeches, and his reactions to losing. Reidy brought players to the club who were prepared to put in the hard yards and the punishing pre-seasons. JR thought his team would have been the fittest in SGL history.

In 1980 the A Grade finished fifth after losing to Risdon in the Elimination final (16.14 to 13.9). However, the team did win 10 games for the season after finishing eighth in 1979. The signs were good for some rewarding years ahead. John held regular meetings with committees, players and their partners letting them know that he did not want any interference with his players. Meanwhile the B Grade team continued their excellent form winning fifteen games for 1981 and then the Grand Final. The club finally had some strength in its squad and the committee led by Big Bruce knew that they were on the right track.

In 1981, South finally broke through for its first A Grade Premiership in seventeen years (since the famous 1964 win) with a win against Risdon (12.17 to 10.12). Best players included Robert Rozee, Dennis Russel, Derek Edmead, Mick Kerin, Robert Fiebig, Rodney Lamshed (1981 Best and Fairest), Don Pasculli and Doug Rozee. The David Shillabeer coached B Grade team took out their fourth consecutive Premiership narrowly against Proprietary (6.11 to 6.10). Best players were Mark Bowman, Colin Scarlett, Robert Harris, Peter Fox, Kelly Grantham and Graham McInnis. This meant that both grades were premiers for the first time in the club's history.

Players during these years will never forget JR's determination for success. They still talk his response to the player who wanted to leave training early to go to table tennis!! The quote.. "Ping pong! You go to ping pong and don't come back until you are dedicated to football" still hovers around the ghosts of Chinnery Park! Another memory is the day at half time John crammed the team in the Central Oval changeroom toilet for some quiet instructions. It was just as well ruckman Boof Rivers had left already to go to a wedding as room in the toilet was at a premium! Craig Cock who had played 206 games for South Adelaide was a great pickup for the club and won the 1980 Madigan Medal. CC was dogged and pacy on ball and his opponents found it hard to keep up with his extreme fitness.

South's good form continued in 1982 but lost the Grand Final to Central (19.25 to 18.18). The same result in the B grade also against Central (12.5 to 8.9) after going through the season undefeated. These results were devastating to the club and to Reidy who had put his heart and soul into the club ably assisted by David Shillabeer. I should also mention that Troy Collins won the U18 Medal in this season.

The social scene was excellently led by the effervescent Keith Kelly who reinvigorated the discos and after match activities. Thus, the club vibe at the time meant it was a great place to be around.

The A Grade Best and Fairest was won by Dennis Russel, a great pickup from Peterborough who was groomed to succeed JR when he returned to Adelaide at the end of 1982. This had a lot to do with winning the 1983 A Grade Premiership.

In closing the club and myself would like to thank John and Di (who John regularly acknowledged was his Brains Trust!) for the memories they created at the club which get a regular airing at times.
